President's message

Becoming a Better Photographer

(An excerpt from "The Myth of Talent" by Craig Tanner.

Be your own biggest supporter – Most of us have become our own biggest critic. Here are five ways to be self-supportive:

- **Be kind... to yourself** Compassion starts with how we treat ourselves. We all have an inner critic that can do a lot of damage if left unchecked.
- Suspend Judgment Quit equating yourself with your artwork. "Am I making progress?" is a much better question to ask than " Is this artwork any good?" The story of greatness is a story that includes many actions that look like failures when

judged out of the context of the whole story.

- Practice, Practice, Practice!!! Disconnect from the outcome. Creativity equals
 conscious productivity. But we often think to be creative we have to make art that
 exhibits greatness every time. That kind of expectation leads to artist block
 because it encourages us to wait for the perfect conditions for greatness instead of
 creating greatness through passionate, deliberate practice. To be more creative be more consciously productive.
- Embrace uncertainty (allow yourself to have a new experience) If put into practice, choosing to be the vision or dream you have for yourself is always leading you into the unlimited potential of the expanding unknown.
- **Be thankful and generous** Be in gratitude for what is and share what you have to offer. Too often we curse what we have and focus on our needs. Turn it around!

class worked on depth of field, exposure compensation and bracketing. In Hilton Head Plantation students explored metering and dynamic range at Dolphin Head beach, then moved on to one of the fountains to experiment with the effect of shutter speed on photographing moving water. The last class session took place at night. The group went to Shelter Cove to photograph a sunset (emphasis on shooting in manual mode and working with K values), and later to try some long exposure night shooting.

After the course was over, the class celebrated its success over lunch and then met for a debrief and image review session at the LENS. A hands-on format and an opportunity to have some breakthrough moments were just a some of the reasons students liked this class!
