No matter what you personal goals are the Club can help you get there. So join in, participate and enjoy the experience.



Itinerary: We will leave at 8:30 am for the one hour drive. We will return at 12:30 with a stop in Savannah at the Crystal Beer Parlor 301 W. Jones St. for lunch arriving home by 2:30.
