President's Message

Backup-Archive

In early January NPR ran a news story expressing the concern that modern historians have regarding the loss of information in our digital age. In the past hard copies of books, letters, news articles, photographs, diaries etc. existed and were accessible to historians.

Today much of that information is electronic. E-mails are lost, photos are never archived, news articles and books may only exist on the internet, web sites are shut down and technology changes (after all who can still read a floppy disc). There is a difference between backing-up images and archiving images. Archiving means transferring the electronic image to a medium which will preserve that image for the future. How can we best preserve our electronic images or our family history? I'm not



sure there is an ideal method but the steps listed below represent some of the best current thinking on the matter.

- 1. Always keep one copy of your unedited images; they are your negatives.
- 2. At given point during processing make sure two copies of your photos exist.
- 3. Maintain a copy of your photos off site.
- 4. Keep all your photos in the single location on your computer.
- 5. Aggressively delete duplicates, blurred, unwanted and bad images.
- 6. Consider saving to an alternative medium (i.e. CD or DVD) until the next better technology comes along.
- 7. Make a print of your most precious images.

For archival purposes no electronic method is foolproof. A CD or DVD may be an answer as long as we have the technology to read that medium. However, after all is said and done paper may be the best archival material.
