President's Message

Thoughts on Composition

Today's cameras have such amazing technology that they can do everything but make a great photograph for you. That "but" refers to composition. Composition is the aspect of the medium that is completely dependent on your efforts as a photographer. It is the part of photography that the camera cannot do on its own. Therefore, good composition is not something that can be achieved by expensive photography gear alone. Along the same

lines, you may have a very astute eye, but without the aptitude to effectively use your camera, you may lack the ability to make the photograph that you perceive in your mind.

Photography is a technically based art form. Even the world's best composition can be ruined if the image is out of focus, badly overor underexposed, or the result of some poorly chosen camera settings. On the other hand, a photographer can make a technically perfect image with a composition that is sorely lacking.



If you do not have that "eye," there is still hope. Don't give up! Much of composition can be learned. Consciousness of good composition can be applied to your images even if you struggle to see it unconsciously. Art is, at times, elusive to some photographers. However, if you love the art you create, no one should be able to take that away from you regardless of how you frame it. Learn to use your camera, apply the rules of good composition then break those rules and make the images you enjoy. In the words of Ansel Adams, "There are no rules for good photographs, only good photographs."


