President's Message

It's already August and time to get serious about **creating** an image to enter in our <u>September competition</u>. Emphasis added to "creating" as our theme of **LONG EXPOSURE** offers a great opportunity to explore your artistic side. You can just let your creative juices flow with this theme. But keep in mind that "Long Exposure" implies movement or some type of blurring in the image. Typically, winning images will include some portion in sharp

focus as well. Depending upon your subject or technique, "long exposure" could be as fast as 1/15 second or as long as several minutes. Long exposure can be at dusk or night (e.g. blurred car lights or star trails) requiring little more than a tripod. Or you can take long exposures in the middle of the day using techniques like panning or using neutral density (ND) filters of 5 to 10 stops of ND effect. The ND filters allow you to produce a more



creative sky with moving / streaking clouds. Streaking cloud images is a good opportunity to use your widest angle lens as well. ND filters are also helpful with subjects like waves in the ocean or water falls. Polarizing filters work well when shooting sunlit water subjects and they add about 2 stops of ND effect. Try stacking your filters for even slower shutter

speeds. Use manual exposure mode when using ND filters. You can google to find a ND long exposure chart or download an app (e.g. ND Timer or ND Filter). I've said enough. Be creative and explore the possibilities. I look forward to seeing your images in September.

Field Trips 2016-17

We're excited to announce eleven field trips for the coming club year.

- September 29 Middleton Place is one of the glorious mansions along the Ashley River National Scenic Road. The Beautiful gardens, inspired by Versailles, have been preserved. Sheep graze on the lawn. Artisans in 18th century costume demonstrate textile weaving, blacksmith forging, pottery wheeling and barrel coppering.
- October 13-14 Brookgreen Gardens. This overnight trip will visit these
 themed gardens that are embellished with 1450 pieces of figurative sculpture
 over 500 acres. We will also visit the historic port of Georgetown and the
 boutiques of Pawley's Island.
- **November 4 Harbour Island.** We will visit this gated community to view the birds of the fall migration on the beach. The Plovers will be the highlight.
- November 16 Mepkin Abbey Charleston. Hundreds of Crèches from all over the world are on display in the wonderful gardens of the abbey.
- December 9 Paris Island Graduation and tour. This impressive one hour ceremony culminates the training of new Marines. We also will tour the base and visit the Marine Museum.
- January Sun City Model Railroad Layout-details to follow
- February 3 Wormsloe State Historic Site. Colonial Faire and Muster

- celebration where reenactors in Revolutionary War era costume engage in many activities of the 18th century.
- March 21 Old Sheldon Church. The Dogwoods will be in bloom surrounding the historic ruin. We will also visit Tomaltley Plantation with its marvelous alley of Live Oaks.
- April 6 Nemours Wildlife Foundation, Combahee River. Established in 1995 by Eugene Dupont, this 9,800 acre refuge is home to almost 300 birds.
- April 18 Audubon Society's Francis Beidler Forest is home to the largest stand of 1000 year old Cypress in the world which reflect in the black water.
- May 10 Donnelly and Bear's Island Wildlife Management Areas to shoot the historic farmstead, beautiful landscapes and nesting birds.

The Photographer's Corner Helen Levitt

For more than seventy years, Helen Levitt (1913-2009) used her camera to capture fresh and unstudied views of everyday life on the streets of New York City. Roaming through the Lower East Side, Spanish Harlem and other urban neighborhoods, Levitt began her career equipped with a handheld Leica with a right-angle viewfinder that allowed her to remain unobtrusive as she documented life in the city.
