## **Fall Classes planned**

### Don't be late for Class!

The class schedule for the new club year is about ready to be posted. Classes to help improve your photography or learn a new skill will be offered, with several one-night classes on varied topics as well.

Here's a quick rundown on what we will be offering:

**Intro to Editing Software** Which software should you buy? An overview of the most popular editing software: *Photoshop, Lightroom, Photoshop Elements, Topaz.* This three-week class will meet end of Sept and into Oct.

**Photography 101** is designed to help you learn how to use your camera functions. Improve the quality of your images with basic knowledge of exposure, metering, depth of field and more. Class will meet for 5 weeks in Oct. and into Nov.

**Photoshop Elements** a comprehensive look at all of the features of Elements for organizing and editing your images. Class will also include a one-on-one session with each student. Elements class will be six sessions, beginning late Nov. and concludes mid-Dec.

A few **one-evening sessions** will also be offered for Novice Critiques, Cutting your own Mats, and a Welcome to the Club session for new members.

### September Competition: Long Exposure

Submission Deadline: Sept. 25th at Midnight

Long exposure usually means that the shutter speed is 1/2 second or slower. This also

means that the ambient light is very dim, or you are using some neutral density filter to tame the light reaching the sensor/film. Using a long exposure will create a stripey/silky look with moving water or clouds, while any object in movement may have a ghostly appearance.

Here is an article that may help you a little with some tips from *Fstoppers* web site: <u>Long</u> <u>Exposure is so much fun but...</u>

Once you have the shot for this month's print competition, please do the following:

- Prepare your digital file and get a nice print ready for the meeting
- Resize your file in accordance to the <u>Rules and Guidelines</u> published in the Club website.
   While you are there, get yourself familiar with the judges guidelines that we provide to each judge days before the competition: <u>judging guidelines</u>.

One of the glorious mansions along the Ashley River National Scenic Road <u>Middleton Place</u> plantation was the home of rice farmer Arthur Middleton who signed the declaration of Independence. The gardens, which were inspired by Versailles, have been preserved as it was during his tenure. Sheep graze on the lawn, artisans in period costume demonstrate textile weaving, blacksmith forging, pottery wheeling and barrel coopering. Three separate tours are available as part of the **admission** fee of **\$28**.
