Symmetry can be in large scale structure as well as in tiny objects or natural patterns. By the way we have lots of fallen trees that are or were creating interesting symmetry.

The Photographer's Corner: Steve McCurry

Steve McCurry (1950), recognized universally as one of today's finest image-makers, is best known for his evocative color photography. In the finest documentary tradition, McCurry captures the essence of human struggle and joy. Born in Philadelphia, McCurry graduated cum laude from the College of Arts and Architecture at the Pennsylvania State University. After working at a newspaper for two years, he left for India to freelance. It was in India that McCurry learned to watch and wait on life. "If you wait," he realized, "people will forget your camera and the soul will drift up into view." He is the recipient of numerous awards, including Magazine Photographer of the Year, awarded by the National Press Photographers Association. This was the same year in which he won an unprecedented four first prizes in the World Press Photo contest. He has won the Olivier Rebbot Award twice. McCurry has covered many areas of international and civil conflict, including Beirut, Cambodia, the Philippines, the Gulf War, the former Yugoslavia, Afghanistan, and Tibet. He focuses on the human consequences of war, not only showing what war impresses on the landscape, but rather, on the human face.

"When painting (read: photographing) outdoors, sit on your hands and look before starting."

I recently came upon *[The Painter's Primer](#)*, a list of 100 things that can contribute to an artist's success. Simply change the word "painter" to "photographer" and the advice is just as applicable to us.

Consider the suggestion to "sit on your hands." Our October presenter Mark Tierney alluded to this when he spoke of contemplating his subjects before even beginning to shoot. Looking with a contemplative eye, really seeing your subject, and in fact having a vision of your shot is critical to a successful photograph. "Sitting on your hands" may just be the best way to compose a photo for which you can clearly answer the question, *what's the subject?*
